The Academic Assistance Program (AAP) is for students with documented academic support needs or learning differences. AAP seeks to provide students with educational accommodations to support and assist them in reaching their highest academic potential.

Program Fees

Basic Program

Individualized Accommodations \$1,400/year (in addition to regular tuition)

Academic Center for Enrichment (ACE)

Individualized Accommodations \$2,750/year (in addition to regular tuition)

Academic support needs such as the use of supportive technology or preferential seating are available at no cost and based on the student's individual, demonstrated need.

Basic Program:

Individualized accommodations are available to students who provide proper documentation. Accommodations involving additional time, any modification of class standards, or testing accommodations require enrollment in the Basic Program. All accommodations are individualized and based on demonstrated need.

ACE:

Students enrolled in ACE receive extra instruction and support during an ACE class period through one-on-one and small group learning, in addition to the accommodations describe in the Basic Program. They will work with an instructor to improve their skills, organization, and understanding in their other classes. The ACE instructor responsibilities include monitoring student assignment completion and grades, supporting effective organization and self-regulation skills, and communicating regularly with students, teachers and parents regarding student progress. ACE students have a responsibility to use their ACE time productively and without disruption to the learning of other students, while employing the management tools and resources available to them in ACE. The ACE course provides five elective credits per semester.

Some new students may be required to enroll in ACE based on information collected during the admissions process.

ACE is **not** a special education program. All MVCS students must have academic profiles that are average or above, as measured by indicators such as standardized test scores.
