Grade Transfer Policy (Transcripts)

Monte Vista Christian School considers the home country/former school transcript(s) submitted during the admission/enrollment process to be the student's official transcript(s). These are the only transcripts that will be accepted for transfer credits.

Monte Vista will not change grades on its transcript, despite any subsequently received transcripts from the student's home country/school.

Monte Vista Christian School will only transfer a course from another school if we offer an equivalent course.

Monte Vista Christian School understands many countries use an examination system for grading, and we accept those grades as represented on the originally submitted transcript.

Monte Vista Christian School utilizes the World Education Services (WES) Grade Conversion Guide to interpret foreign grades/transcripts, and the International Baccalaureate guide to interpret IB grades and transcripts.

*International students who are repeating grade 9 for the purpose of English language skill improvement may choose not to have their 9th grade "middle school" grades from their home country posted on their Monte Vista transcript (if they are age-appropriate for grade 9 in the United States). If the choice is not to have those 9th grade "middle school" grades, posted the student and family must realize this decision is final. The student and family must also understand that application to a college/university in the United States may require they provide an official "middle school" transcript to the college/university accepted to, and be ready to explain why they choose not to have those grades reported by Monte Vista. In addition, if the student/family wishes to have the 9th grade "middle school" grades listed on their Monte Vista transcript, then all transferable courses will be listed by Monte Vista. Once the courses are on the Monte Vista transcript they may not removed or changed.
